



Free National Parks Access Pass


Available for Individuals with Disabilities of any age!

National parks and recreation sites are popular summer destinations! U.S. residents with disabilities can receive a free "Access Pass" that offers lifetime free admission for the passholder and up to three accompanying adults to these federal venues (not valid at State parks or local city/county recreation sites). To receive the pass, individuals with disabilities are asked to present official documentation of disability status to the National Parks Service, either in person or by mail. A physician's statement or a document issued by a state or federal agency (Veteran's Administration, Social Security Disability Income, Supplemental Security Income) is acceptable. 
