About DCBDD

DCBDD is a county agency primarily funded by levy dollars which provides support to people with developmental disabilities and their families in Delaware County. People receive services in many forms:

- Support to live a quality and fulfilled life
- Resources to enhance children's learning and development
- Employment support - finding and maintaining a job
- Connections to community resources & social groups
- Assistance with daily living needs and learning new skills



Supporting around 2,500 individuals and families throughout their lifespan



Average Cost of Service Per Person
Birth - 2: \$3,108 Adults: \$16,293
Children: \$2,101



On average, enrollment increases by 3% each year



Nearly 500 service providers supporting people of all ages in our community



Received a three-year accreditation from the State for excellent service



79% of the people DCBDD supports are children. In the next 5 years, 159 children will transition to adulthood, increasing costs by nearly \$8.5 M over the 5 years

Continuous Levy Information

- DCBDD is on the ballot for a 0.4 Mil Continuous Levy
- 0.4 Mil Levy would generate \$3,131,579 per year to support continued growth and demand for services
- Costs the taxpayer \$14.00 per year (based on a home valuation of \$100,000)
- In 2020, DCBDD's two existing levies expire. At this time, DCBDD will allow the 0.56 Mil Levy to expire and evaluate the need to adjust the 2.1 Mil Levy based on 2018 and 2019 actuals.
